Synonyms and Antonyms

Synonyms

Synonyms are words that have exactly the same or almost similar meaning as the other given word or words. For example, the word "develop" is a synonym of the word "evolve". "grow", "produce", etc. are synonyms of the word "develop".

Some other examples of synonyms include:

- Adhere comply
- Pardon forgive
- Bleak austere
- Callous obdurate
- Enormous huge
- Cunning clever
- Despair misery
- Gloomy bleak
- Humble modest
- Sordid dirty

- Abolish abrogate
- Adamant stubborn
- Benevolent benign
- Calamity misfortune
- Concede permit
- Quickly rapidly
- Ferocious fierce
- Haughty arrogant
- Destroy devastate
- Destitute pauper

Note: It must be remembered that synonyms cannot always be used interchangeably. In English, a word may have many synonyms but all these words may not be used interchangeably. We should also know the contextual meaning of the word and then we should use it in a sentence. For example, although the words "finish" and "complete" are generally regarded as synonyms, they cannot always be used interchangeably.

Consider the following sentences:

- He has a complete list of all the guests who were invited.
- She will finish eating her lunch soon.

Hence, it is very essential to know the context and the intent before using any synonymous word.

Antonyms

Antonyms are defined as words that have opposite meanings. Therefore, such words have contradictory connotations. Following are some examples of antonyms:
