Synonyms and Antonyms

Synonyms

Synonyms are words that have exactly the same or almost similar meaning as the other given word or words.

For example, the word 'convince' is a synonym of the word 'persuade'. 'Coax' and 'cajole' are synonyms of the word 'persuade'.

Some other examples of synonyms include:

- Deplete-exhaust
- Callous-insensitive
- Cynical-sceptical
- Flimsy-fragile
- Incessant-perpetual
- Reticent-reserved
- Temporal-worldly
- Malice-hatred
- Lament-bemoan
- Liberal-lavish

- Abhor-detest
- Dexterity-proficiency
- Emulate-imitate
- Denounce-condemn
- Pensive-thoughtful
- Yearn-long
- Reiterate-mournful
- Indignant-resentful
- Meagre-paltry
- Abate-subside

Note: It must be remembered that synonyms cannot always be used interchangeably. In English, a word may have many synonyms but all these words may not be used interchangeably. We should also know the contextual meaning of the word and then we should use it in a sentence.

For example, although the words "liberal" and "lavish" are generally regarded as synonyms, they cannot always be used interchangeably.

Consider the following sentences:

- His films reflect the more liberal values of the 1960s.
- It was one of the most lavish weddings I have ever been to.

Hence, it is very essential to know the context and the intent before using any synonymous word.

Antonyms

Antonyms are defined as words that have opposite meanings. Therefore, such words have contradictory connotations. Following are some examples of antonyms:
